

Superior Township Hall

3040 N. Prospect Road, Superior Township, MI 48198



The Township Hall of Superior Township is located at the very center of the township, at the intersection of Prospect Road and Cherry Hill Road. It serves a number of functions, including housing township governmental offices of the Supervisor, Treasurer and Clerk; business offices of

township departments; and providing meeting space for township commissions and committees, as well as accommodating needs of the community for meeting space and other activities. Our current Township Hall, built in 1952, is the second structure to serve the township. It was built to replace the original Township Hall and to provide the first home for the previously all-volunteer fire department. The original two-bay fire department space is now occupied by staff of the Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department. The southwest wing, containing the newer, larger meeting hall, was added in 2001.

The first Township Hall, built in 1874, was originally located diagonally across from the current Township Hall, on the southwest corner of the Prospect Road/Cherry Hill Road intersection, in the area now maintained by Washtenaw County as Superior Center Park. When the building was vacated after the construction of the new Township Hall, the structure was moved to a gravel quarry further west on Cherry Hill Road. In 1986 the original hall was moved once more, with great ceremony, to the township center area, rehabilitated and restored. It serves as meeting space for the Parks and Recreation Commission and Neighborhood Watch, as well as serving other community needs.
