PROPOSED MINUTES
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1. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Charter Township of Superior Board of Trustees was called to order by Supervisor Dabish Yahkind at 7:00 p.m. on February 17, 2026, at the Charter Township of Superior Hall, 3040 N. Prospect Road, Superior Township, Michigan 48198.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Supervisor Dabish Yahkind led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. ROLL CALL

The members present were Supervisor Dabish Yahkind, Trustee Devereaux, Treasurer Lewis, Trustee McKinney, and Trustee Greene.

Absent: Clerk Robinson; Trustee Schwartz.

Trustee Schwartz arrived at 7:10 p.m.

4. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Supervisor Dabish Yahkind requested one addition to the agenda:

- 1. Add a new item under New Business: “Resolution Amending SAFER Grant” as Item 11.C (Resolution 2026-05).**

The motion was made by Trustee McKinney and supported by Trustee Greene to approve the agenda as amended.

The motion carried unanimously.

5. CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

- **Irma Golden** addressed the Board regarding Resolution 2026-03 and expressed concerns related to blight enforcement, road maintenance, snow removal, tree overgrowth near Prospect Road, and drainage issues along MacArthur Boulevard. She requested speed studies for MacArthur Boulevard and Berkshire Drive and referenced prior public comment time allocations.
- **Mrs. Mohammed** requested clarification regarding the names Steve Kraft and Michelle Marin as listed on the New Business submissions.
- **Brenda Baker** commented on the proposed renaming of the Roads and Blight Committee and suggested separating road concerns, beautification efforts, and blight enforcement into distinct committees.

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- **Willie Secrest** shared remarks regarding longtime resident Ellen Kurath and referenced memorial Red Bud trees near Schroeter Park. He also invited residents to attend the Southeast Michigan Land Conservancy winter walk event.

6. SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Supervisor Dabish Yahkind provided updates regarding blight enforcement actions, housing compliance efforts, and recent coordination with the Sheriff's Office. The Supervisor referenced ongoing property condition concerns in the Sycamore Meadows area and discussed previous committee work related to roads and blight matters. Supervisor Yahkind also referenced recent holiday outreach efforts and coordination to connect residents with available services.

RESOLUTION NUMBER: 2026-03

DATE: FEBRUARY 17, 2026

WHEREAS, the Superior Charter Township Board of Trustees establishes committees from time to time to support Township priorities and advance the health, safety, and welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, the Township Board desires to update the structure and focus of certain committees to better align with current Township goals related to community appearance, public spaces, and overall quality of place; and

WHEREAS, renaming the Roads and Blight Committee as the Beautification Committee reflects an emphasis on proactive, collaborative, and community-focused enhancement efforts throughout the Township; and

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WHEREAS, the Beautification Committee is intended to consider matters including, but not limited to, roadway appearance, landscaping, public rights-of-way, property maintenance concerns, and other initiatives that contribute to a well-maintained community; and

WHEREAS, Trustee Sarah Devereaux has expressed a willingness to serve in a leadership role and to assist in advancing Township beautification initiatives in coordination with Township staff and the Board of Trustees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Superior Charter Township Board of Trustees hereby renames the Roads and Blight Committee as the Beautification Committee, effective immediately upon adoption of this resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Beautification Committee shall operate in accordance with direction provided by the Township Board and shall make recommendations related to community appearance and beautification as requested; and

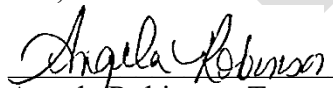
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Trustee Sarah Devereaux is hereby appointed as Lead of the Beautification Committee, responsible for convening meetings, coordinating with Township staff, and reporting committee recommendations and activities to the Board of Trustees; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Township Clerk is directed to update all official Township records, committee listings, and references to reflect the committee name change and leadership designation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Beautification Committee shall report back to the Township Board at the March 2026 regular meeting with a proposed committee charter, recommended membership structure, and suggested operational framework for Board consideration.

CLAIM DEED TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY ROAD COMMISSIONERS OF
WASHTENAW COUNTY (GEDDES ROAD & PROSPECT ROAD)**

The following resolution was moved by Trustee Schwartz and supported by Trustee McKinney.

CLAIM DEED TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY ROAD COMMISSIONERS OF
WASHTENAW COUNTY (GEDDES ROAD & PROSPECT ROAD)**

RESOLUTION NUMBER: 2026-04

DATE: FEBRUARY 17, 2026

WHEREAS, Superior Charter Township is the owner of certain real property located in the Township, being Tax Parcel No. J-10-28-400-010, consisting of approximately 8.15 acres, as more particularly described in Exhibit A to the Quit Claim Deed, and

WHEREAS, Superior Charter Township desires to dedicate a portion of said property for public roadway purposes to the Board of County Road Commissioners of the County of Washtenaw (the "County Road Commission"), a Public Body Corporate, and

WHEREAS, the proposed dedication area consists of right-of-way along Geddes Road and Prospect Road, as depicted and described in the attached Exhibit B (the "ROW Dedication Area", and

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WHEREAS, Exhibit B includes the sketch and legal description of the right-of-way dedication, including the following approximate areas:

- Geddes Road dedication: total 0.569 acres (24,786 sq. ft.), including 0.313 acres existing ROW and 0.256 acres proposed additional ROW; and
- Prospect Road dedication: total 0.809 acres (35,227 sq. ft.), including 0.445 acres existing ROW and 0.364 acres proposed additional ROW, and

WHEREAS, The Quit Claim Deed provides that the conveyance includes a release of claims arising from or incidental to widening, draining, and improving the road, including removal of trees, shrubs, vegetation, gravel, soil, and other materials as determined necessary by the County Road Commission, and

WHEREAS, The Quit Claim Deed further provides that the ROW Dedication Area is subject to easements, restrictions, and other matters of record, existing utilities, rights of the public and governmental units, zoning ordinances, and real estate tax liens not yet due and payable, and

WHEREAS, The Quit Claim Deed is stated to be exempt from State and Local transfer taxes pursuant to MCL 207.505(a) and MCL 207.526(a), and

WHEREAS, The Township Board of Trustees finds that approval of the right-of-way dedication is in the best interests of the Township and the public.

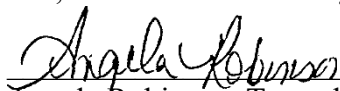
NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: The Superior Charter Township Board of Trustees hereby approves the dedication of the ROW Dedication Area to the Board of County Road Commissioners of the County of Washtenaw for roadway purposes, as set forth in the Quit Claim Deed and its Exhibits, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: The Township Supervisor and Township Clerk (and/or such other authorized Township officials) are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Quit Claim Deed substantially in the form presented to the Board, including all exhibits, and to take such further actions as may be necessary to complete the conveyance, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: Township officials are further authorized to cooperate with the County Road Commission in the recording of the deed and completion of any documentation necessary to effectuate the right-of-way dedication.

During discussion, Township officials clarified that the previously authorized hire satisfies the grant requirements and does not create an additional position.

RESOLUTION NUMBER: 2026-05

DATE: FEBRUARY 17, 2026

WHEREAS, the Superior Charter Township Board previously adopted a resolution authorizing participation in the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the SAFER Grant Program provides federal funding to assist fire departments in increasing or maintaining the number of trained, “front line” firefighters available in the community in order to meet national standards and improve public safety; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the original Board authorization, operational review and funding alignment have resulted in the determination that the Township will proceed with one (1) SAFER-funded firefighter position rather than multiple positions as previously contemplated; and

WHEREAS, the Township received and accepted the SAFER grant on or about December 21, 2025; and

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WHEREAS, the Superior Charter Township Fire Department hired Justin Hoffman on February 16, 2026, and the Township intends to designate Mr. Hoffman as the individual funded under the amended SAFER grant authorization, consistent with FEMA guidelines and program requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Township Board finds that amending the grant authorization to reflect one (1) funded position and formally identifying the hired firefighter is in the best interest of the Township and consistent with the intent of the SAFER grant program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Superior Charter Township Board hereby confirms and approves the amendment of its previously authorized FEMA SAFER Grant participation to reflect funding for one (1) firefighter position; and

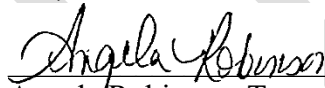
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Township formally designates Justin Hoffman, hired February 16, 2026, as the individual to be funded under the SAFER Grant, subject to all applicable FEMA rules, regulations, and compliance requirements; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Township Supervisor, Clerk, Fire Chief, and any other necessary Township officials are authorized to execute any required documentation, amendments, certifications, or communications with FEMA necessary to effectuate this amendment; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all prior resolutions and actions not inconsistent with this amendment remain in full force and effect.

- **Sharon Phillips** addressed the Board regarding community beautification efforts and related matters.

TRAFFIC STOPS:

This report is generated from deputies' activity logs, which document each traffic stop and the associated reason. The numbers in this report may differ from those on the "Police Service Data Report" page, as that report reflects only verified offenses. For example, a traffic stop verified as an OUID will appear in the "Police Service Data Report" but will not be included in the "Traffic Stops" report.
